Expanding Our Reach: R&T Registrations and Partnerships

We are thrilled to announce progress in R&T registrations:

- In Progress: Cameroon, Niger, and Burkina Faso.
- Validated: Sudan and Chad.

These developments pave the way for more comprehensive and impactful operations across the region.

Localization in Action: Partnering with Local CSOs

- Sudan: Agreements with six CSOs to amplify capacity building, enhance community engagement, and provide direct support to vulnerable populations.
- Chad: One partnership agreement, focusing on strengthening local capacities and service delivery for displaced communities.
- Niger: One partnership agreement aimed at supporting local advocacy and resource mobilization.
- Cameroon: One partnership agreement to improve program implementation and ensure community-centered approaches.
